"I was totally discouraged, but I refused to go back to a life that I knew was not good for me and my family," Q says.

Q was experiencing a tremendous amount of frustration in her job search. While discussing her frustration with a friend, Q told her she turned in 39 job applications and had not been called in for one interview. Her friend told her about Goodwill's Job Placement Services and she met with their Employment Consultant Tandy Collins. She interviewed for a job at Goodwill and was hired the same day! "Q has a good attitude," Tandy explains. "She is dependable, efficient, and willing to do whatever is asked of her."

"I'm happy that my whole life has done a complete turnaround. I'm turning into a role model for my three kids," Q explains. "This is amazing. I never knew it would be like this.
