Description of Goodwill Job-Link Services provided in Moore Haven

The Job-Link center helps people with employment, skills training, and family strengthening. Trained employment consultants can assist with resume preparation, interviewing skills, and access to online employment opportunities. The Job-Link center also provides computer access so that our clients can look for a job and submit online resumes and job applications. Finally, the Job-Link center provides referrals to family strengthening services within the community. In addition, we partner with numerous agencies across Southwest Florida with the common goal of helping individuals become more independent.

Description of Programs Offered at the Moore Haven Job-Link Site

LIHEAP – for Emergency Utility Assistance

Partner: Agriculture and Labor Program Inc. (ALPI)

Assists ALPI in completing the paperwork for program's financial assistance. Program funds are only available one time per year. Must be a resident of Glades County, FL and completing an application is required. Proof of income, social security cards and food stamps & HUD assistance (if receiving) must be presented at time of application.

Voucher Program

Partner: Agape Thrift Store – Moore Haven, FL

Vouchers are based on individuals' need and limited by availability of store's supplies. The amount will typically be \$50 and must be a Glades County resident.

ACCESS

Partner: Department of Children and Families

Assistance is provided to those who wish to apply for benefits such as Food Stamps, and Medicaid.

VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program)

Partners: IRS

VITA is a free tax preparation program for low and moderate income persons. Preparation is done by IRS certified volunteers.

Youth Connections

Partner: SWFL Works/Henkels & McCoy

Florida Youth Connections (FYC) is a Workforce Investment Act funded youth services program geared to serve at-risk In-School and/or Out-of-School young adults ages 16 – 21. The age range and In-School or Out-of-School service offerings vary by each local Workforce Investment Area and there are 12 local areas in Florida.
